Meet the artists...



Deborah Last explores the landscape through a daily painting practice, capturing the light and weather of the changing seasons. Her contemporary style, expressive colour and intriguing brush strokes blend with a traditional form of art. She has begun to populate her paintings, exploring the connections we have made to the landscapes around us whilst in lockdowns. In 2020 she graduated with an MA in Contemporary Art Practice from Plymouth University. She has been long listed for the Jackson's Painting Prize, 2021 and 2022; was Artist in residence at the National Trust's Bucks Mills Artist Cabin in August 2022 and the inaugural visual artist in residence for Appledore Book Festival in September 2022.

Lee Holman is The Coastal Creative, a concept born out of Lee's passion for design, living by the sea and the unique coastline. A proud Devonian, born and bred, illustrator by profession, he is able to capture the natural beauty and iconic scenes of his beloved county in various styles and mediums. Working for interior & architectural design practices, he established himself as a freelance illustrator before setting up his own visualisation and design consultancy for 35 successful years. Now back in Devon he draws on his artistic skills to represent the life of this wonderful county to create pieces with a personal connection and heart.

Tom Stevenson is based in Devon where he works from life to create paintings that follow a path between figurative and abstract styles to explain the light and colour of his surroundings. He relies upon the uncontrollability of oil as a medium to build a fresh and organic surface and is drawn to subjects such as the coast, figures and dramatic skies. His work is underpinned by strong composition constructed around a simple compositional idea or collection of colours. Tom is an elected member of the Royal Institute of Oil Painters (ROI) and an Academician of the South West Academy (SWAc). He studied at Plymouth College of Art and Design, Bath School of Art and holds a degree in Fine Art from Exeter College of Art and Design.

Wendy Harrison is a mixed media painter based in North Devon. She has worked in digital design and illustration for over 30 years, building a renowned business designing personalised art and children's books. She has now returned to traditional painting using various mediums including acrylic, oil, coloured pencil, ink and pastel. She works on gesso panels, wood and raw linen, building up layers of texture using bold brushmarks and splashes of contrasting colour. Wendy paints still life and landscape, especially the coasts of North and South Devon and was recently a wildcard entry in Sky Arts Landscape painter of the year.



The artists are joined by Nicola Relph, an amateur artist living in North Devon. She has painted throughout her life and always found it to be an incredibly relaxing and enjoyable hobby. She has just started painting plein air, which combines her love of painting, nature, walking and having fun with like minded people.

Lundy Art Trail has been planned by Jane Sharkey and Lee Holman who met on Lundy, where Jane works as a General Assistant. Jane is currently studying for an MA in Fine Art at Plymouth University of Arts. She is a multi-disciplinary artist who explores landscape through the senses using a variety of mediums including weaving, land art and writing. 







I researched walking scores and created a book of 27 scores. The idea being that these could be taken outdoors and used as prompts in which to interact with the landscape.










Finding the Knight Templar rock on Lundy led the way for developing a pilgrimage. The Knight Templar were given Lundy in the 12-13C - there were challenged by the Marisco Pirates for the land.





Knight Templar rock print was passed to me by a Lundy visitor who had been given it by John Dyke. John was llustrator of the Illustrated Lundy News from 1970 to 1975. Permission to use the print was given to me by the family of John Dyke and I then had a stamp created for the Passport.

The idea of a souvenier /votive jar came from Barush, K., (2021) Imaging Pilgrimage: Art as Embodied Experience and also a visit to Finisterre, the end of the Camino where people burnt their shoes.


